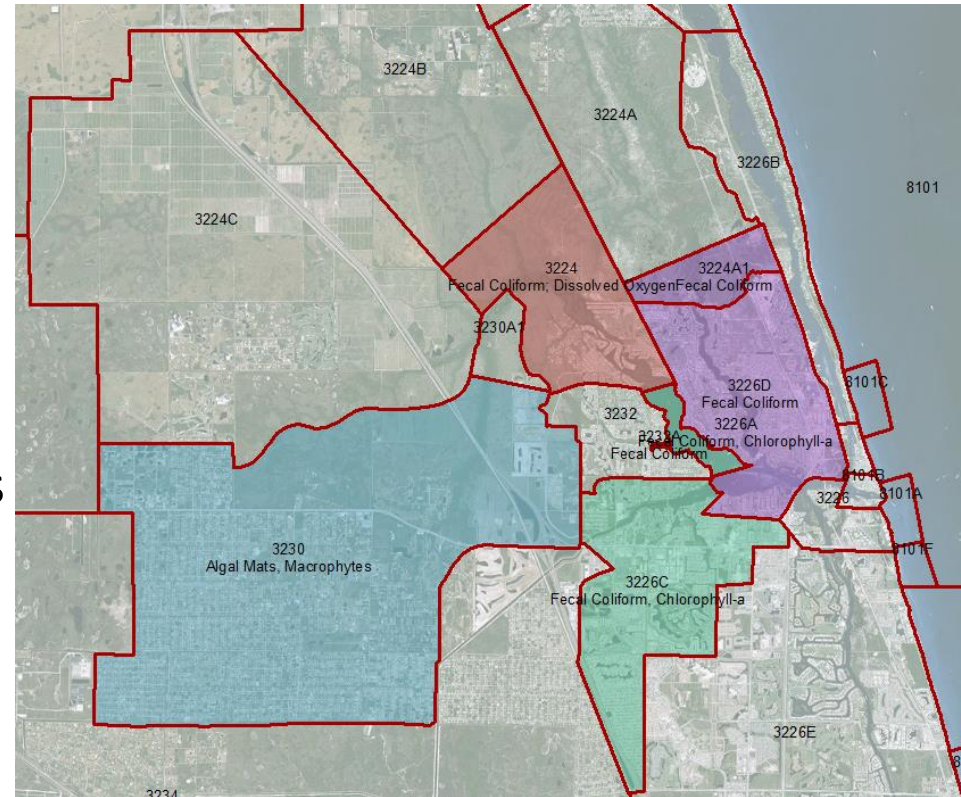
What's happening in the Lox?

- LRMCC - Reasonable Assurance Plan
- LRPI – significant turn-dirt work in watershed
- LRD Neighborhood Sewering
- LRD Environmental Monitoring
 - Data accessible online through Power BI



FDEP Determined Segments of the Loxahatchee River Are Impaired

- Next steps are to:
 - Develop Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL)
 - Develop Basin Management Action Plan (BMAP)
 - Implement restoration projects
- **OR** local stakeholders may pursue Reasonable Assurance Plan



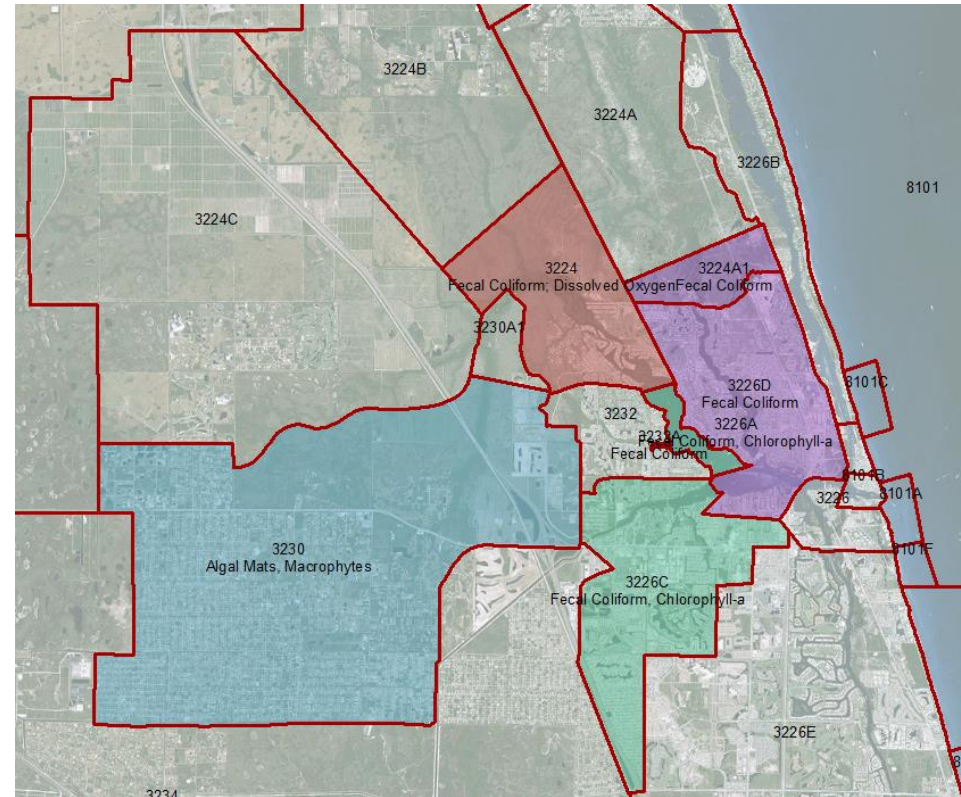
Loxahatchee River Management Coordinating Council

- Reasonable Assurance Plan (4b)
 - Provide an implementation schedule and resource commitments that there are, or will be, pollutant loading reductions that will result in the waterbody achieving water quality targets to attain and maintain the designated use.
- June 27, 2016 LRMCC took action to pursue Reasonable Assurance Plan development in coordination with DEP.



LRMCC Reasonable Assurance Plan

- Proactive effort yields faster path to restoration
- Stakeholders control their destiny (plan put forth prior to federal or state plan)
- More efficient and effective than TMDL/BMAP
- Avoid TMDL-related regulatory requirements
- Stakeholders receive credit for pollutant reductions



Loxahatchee River Preservation Initiative

A multi-agency and stakeholder based advisory group organized primarily for the purpose of soliciting, ranking and submitting to the Florida Legislature a list of local projects focused on the preservation and restoration of water quality and habitats in the Loxahatchee River and its watershed.

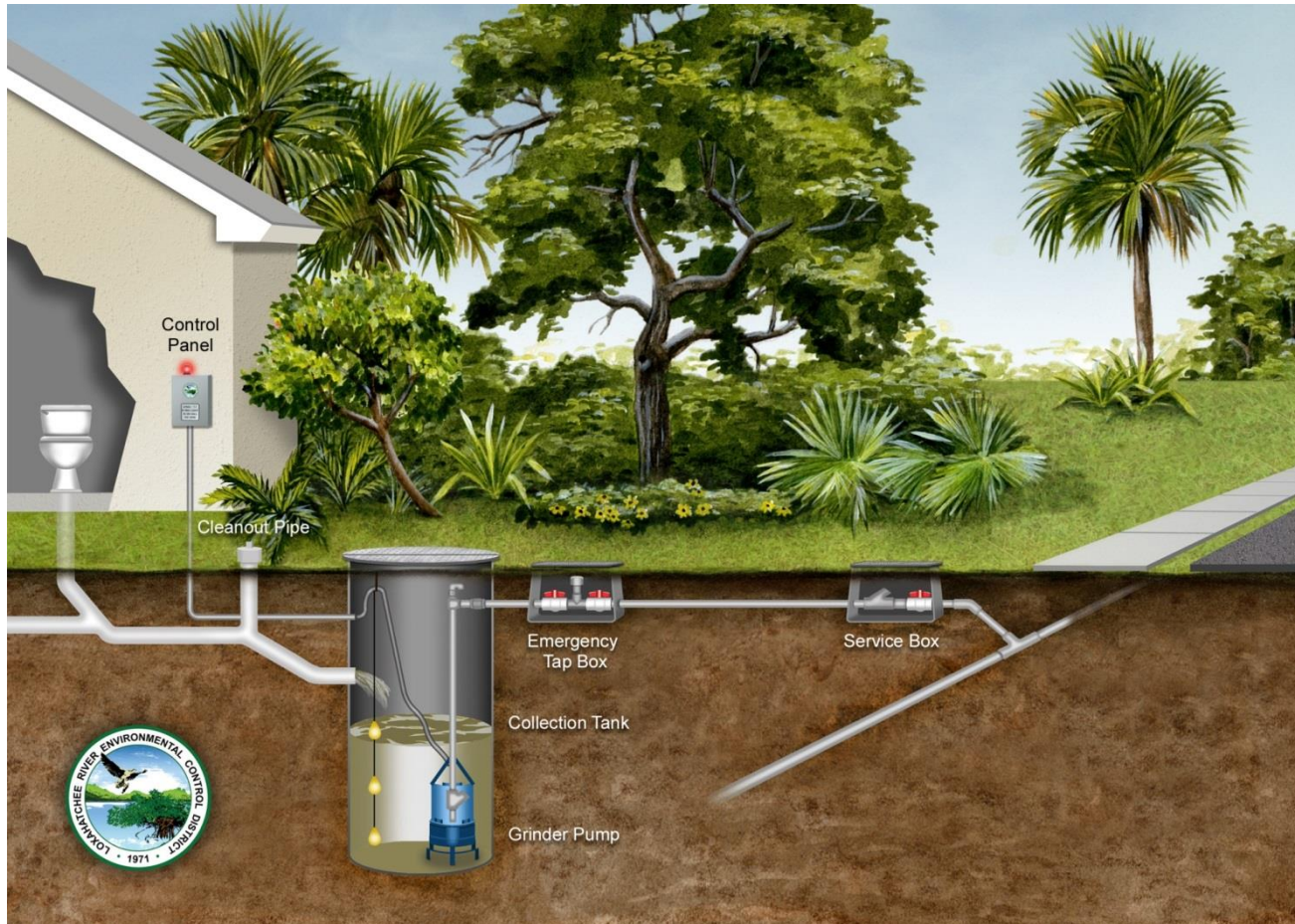


LRD Neighborhood Sewering Gravity Sewer

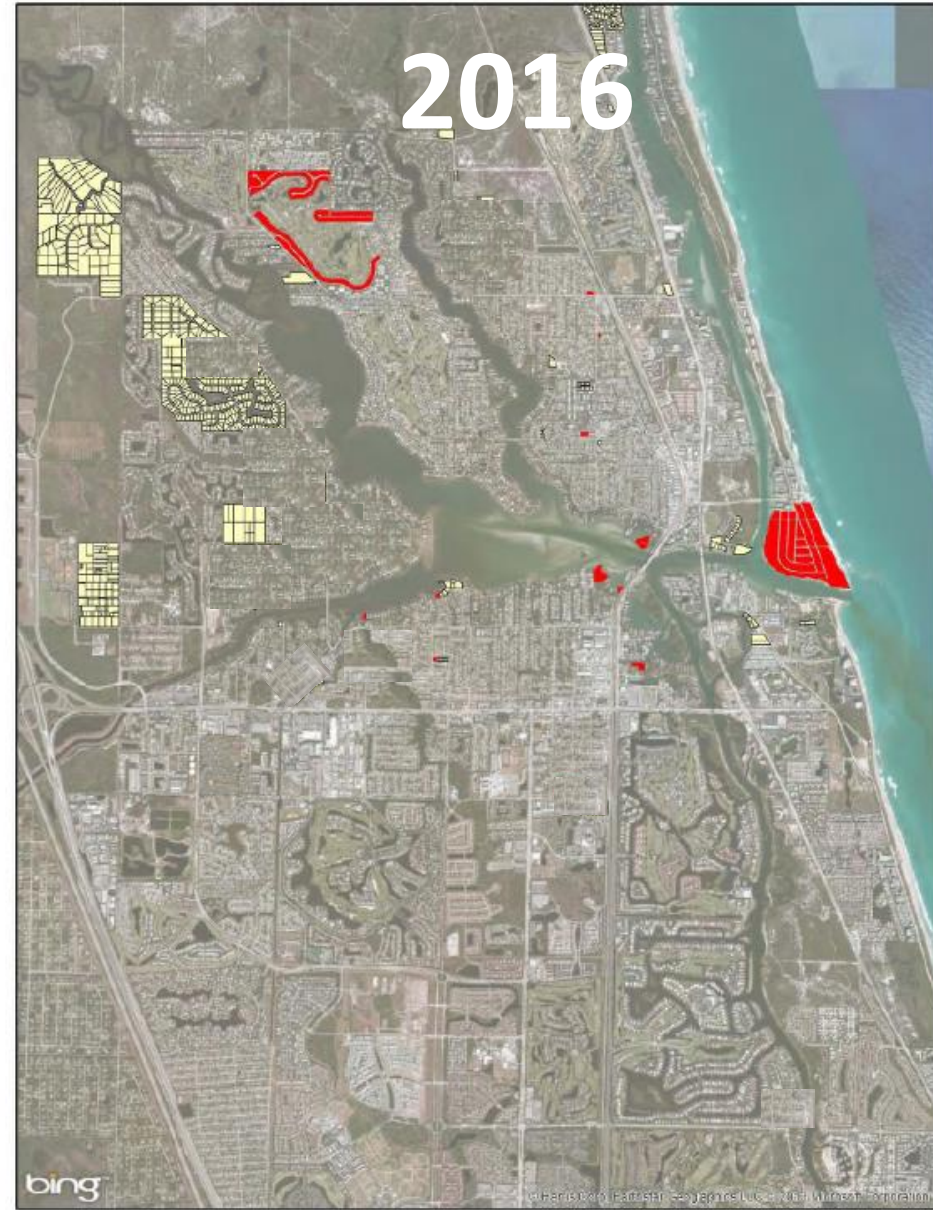

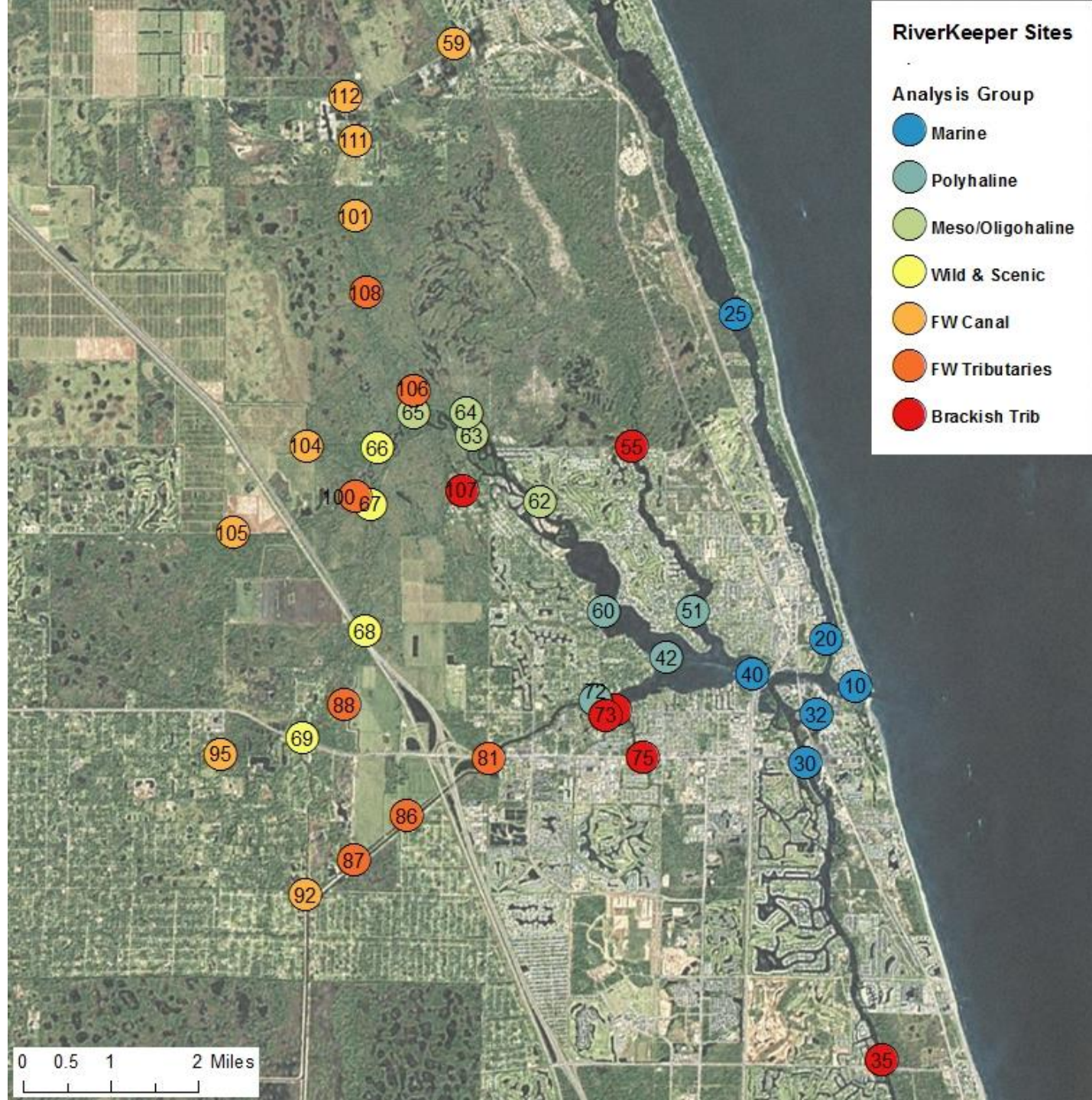
